

BOARD OF EDUCATION, THURSDAY, FEBRUARY 14, 2019

The Board of Education met in regular session on Thursday, February 14, 2019, with the following members present: Mr. Crews, Mrs. Rayhel, Mr. Cook, Mr. Gard, Mr. Littlejohn, and Mr. Macke. Superintendent Mr. Ross and administrator Mr. Ritchey were present along with Mr. Engerski.

Mr. Macke called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Mrs. Rayhel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

During the open comment session, Pastor Rex Goble offered a prayer.

In the absence of Mrs. Hendrix, Mr. Crews was as appointed secretary.

Mr. Engerski reported to the Board that a state inspection had taken place. The inspector took 2 buses out of service and gave a warning for 3 other buses. Misty Wieland has been employed as a sub driver. Mr. Engerski thanked Debbie Mullen for getting the new sub drivers through their testing and getting them ready to get certified. Mr. Engerski also told the Board that one of the boilers went down. It will be quite an expensive fix. There are 2 boilers and they are alternated each week.

Mr. Ross discussed with the Board: progress with the website and app development; progress with the selection of payroll and accounting software, legislation including the 3% salary cap; potential legislation for \$40,000 minimum teacher salary; potential legislation for \$15.00 minimum wage; and the property tax relief grant was applied for was not granted.
